

International Baccalaureate

The University of Minnesota, Morris offers students who earn qualifying scores in International Baccalaureate (IB) subjects a head start on their University education. Students in IB programs receive 8 credits at UMM for each higher-level subject passed with a grade of 5 or higher. Credit awards and how they will apply to the General Education Requirements are outlined below.

Those who earn a full IB diploma, with a score of 30 or more and no scores lower than 4, receive 8 semester credits for each of three higher level exams and 2 credits for three subsidiary level exams. Subsidiary exams that are not part of the full IB diploma are not awarded credit, but may be used for placement in University courses.
