

Basically, repeat the Nietzsche questions in (B) and (D) for Gide. In your answer, be sure you quote at least 10 passages from the text in order to support your answer. These questions, as applied to Gide, are as follows:

(1) Outline the view of a human being that Michel develops in this novel. You can call this his philosophy of mind.

(2) Outline Michel's ethics. Are the notions of creation and assessment important in Michel's views? Outline Michel's "prescription" for human beings while also including the ways in which we can stray from the path. When you answer the final part of this question, explain what Marceline means when she says "I understand your doctrine ... no doubt it is a fine one ... but it leaves out the weak." (p. 112).
