

# July in Paris

July 1 through July 31, 2010



Notre Dame de Paris

**Program Description:** Spend a month exploring the “City of Lights” while taking intensive French courses at the Sorbonne. See fireworks shooting through the art-nouveau ironwork of the Eiffel Tower on Bastille Day, and cyclists from around the world crossing the finish line of the Tour de France. Experience all the great masterworks of French art; visit the American cemetery at Normandy Beach, roam the medieval streets of Mont-Saint-Michel, and relish fresh seafood on the northerly beaches of Saint Malo. Picture yourself strolling through the chateau and gardens of Louis XIV at Versailles and seeing the rose window at Notre Dame. Walk in the footsteps of Astérix, Piaf and Sartre....imagine yourself in Paris. Excursions: Whether individually or as a group, participants will have the opportunity to see many of Paris’s landmarks and cultural sites. Two to four afternoons per week are devoted to group excursions; other afternoons are free. Two weekends are scheduled and two are free for travel outside of Paris or France. Lodging: Each participant has a single room at the Fondation des États-Unis on the campus of the University of Paris. The “cité” has athletic facilities, dining,, ATM, computer lab, wireless, laundry, post office and other amenities on the premises.



**Faculty Profile:** Stephen Martin is an Assistant Professor of French whose research focuses on the editing and digitizing of medieval manuscripts and on modern conceptions of the Middle Ages. In addition to teaching the French language, he teaches courses on the Middle Ages and Renaissance in firm, on marginalized peoples in the premodern era and on the history of the French language. Professor Martin led the 2009 July in Paris program, has travelled to French-speaking Canada and France.
