DNCE 1331 - Ballet_I (ART/P)

(1.0 cr [max 2.0 cr]; Prereq-1321 or WSS 1321 or #; fall, spring, every year)

A basic study of ballet including its vocabulary, technique and history. Appropriate for beginning level students or students who have completed DNCE 1321 or 1322. Rationale (see instructions): This change reflects the implementation of a sequence of levels whereby students may progress in technical skills and work at an appropriate level. The course number change reflects the creation of Level I technique classes.

DNCE 1332 - Jazz Dance I (ART/P)

(1.0 cr [max 2.0 cr]; Prereq-1322 or WSS 1331 or #; spring, every year)

A basic study of jazz dance including it's technique, history and applications. Appropriate for beginning level students or students who have completed DNCE 1321 or 1322.

Rationale (see instructions): This change reflects the implementation of a sequence of levels whereby students may progress in technical skills and work at an appropriate level.

DNCE 1333 - Modern Dance_I (ART/P)

(1.0 cr [max 2.0 cr]; Prereq 1321 or 1322 or WSS 1321 or WSS 1331 or #; spring, every year)

A basic study of modern dance including alignment, technique and history. Appropriate for beginning level students or students who have completed DNCE 1321 or 1322.

Rationale (see instructions): This change reflects the implementation of a sequence of levels whereby students may progress in technical skills and work at an appropriate level. The change in credit hours from 2 to 1 will align this course with the other Level 2 courses and accommodate more students' schedules.
