

2009-2010 Cost of Education Worksheet

This worksheet will help you/your parent(s) determine your out of pocket cost for the 2009-2010 academic year at the University of Minnesota, Morris (UMM).

Below are the direct expenses to attend UMM for 2009-2010 year. Tuition and fees are based on the 13 + credit tuition band. Housing and meal plan costs are based on double occupancy and 19 meals per week.

***Estimated balance due** – This is the amount that you will pay out of pocket. Consider these options for covering your balance due:

If you have been awarded **Federal Work-Study**, these funds are paid directly to you on a bi-weekly basis for hours worked after you have secured a job. Add your work-study award amount to the *estimated balance due if you do not plan to seek work-study or if you plan to use these funds for your personal expenses.

Not included in the estimated cost of education are transportation, personal, loan fees, or miscellaneous expenses (maximum estimated at \$2,500). Since these costs vary for each student, you should determine your cost and budget accordingly. Add this amount to the *estimated balance due if you need to cover these expenses with financial aid.
