INSTEAD, STUDENTS WILL HAVE ACCESS TO THIS MATERIAL IN TWO COURSES RATHER THAN ONE TAUGHT AT A LOWER LEVEL. Old: THE 2000 LEVEL CURRENTLY INDICATED FOR THE COURSE IS MISLEADING BOTH IN THE AMOUNT AND CHALLENGE OF THE WORK IN THE COURSE. STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO WORK BEYOND THE INTRODUCTORY LEVEL. MOST STUDENTS TAKING THIS COURSE ARE JUNIORS OR SENIORS.
